# HOW TO

# build a kite

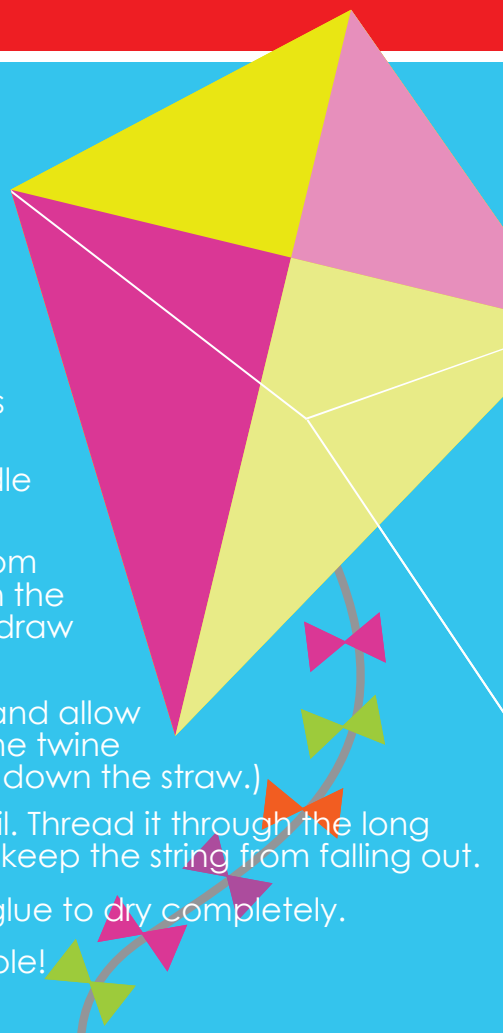
## SUPPLIES NEEDED

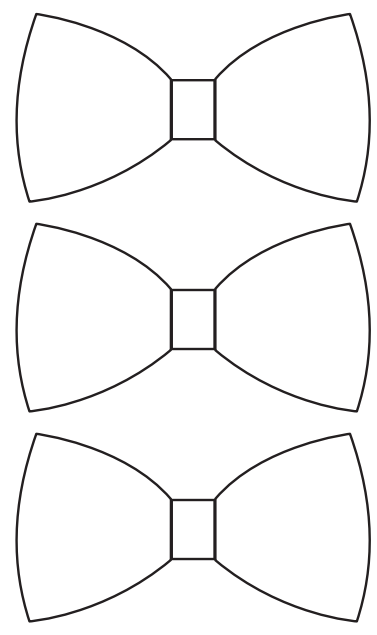
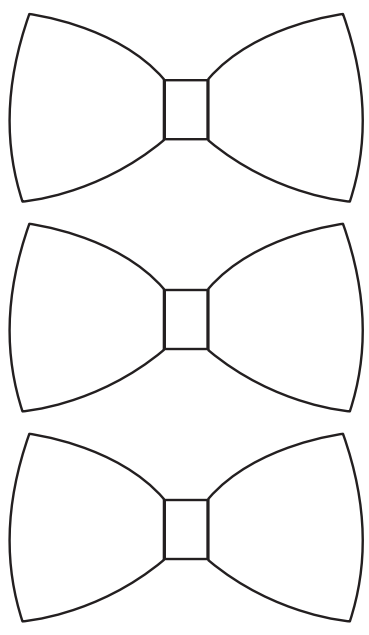
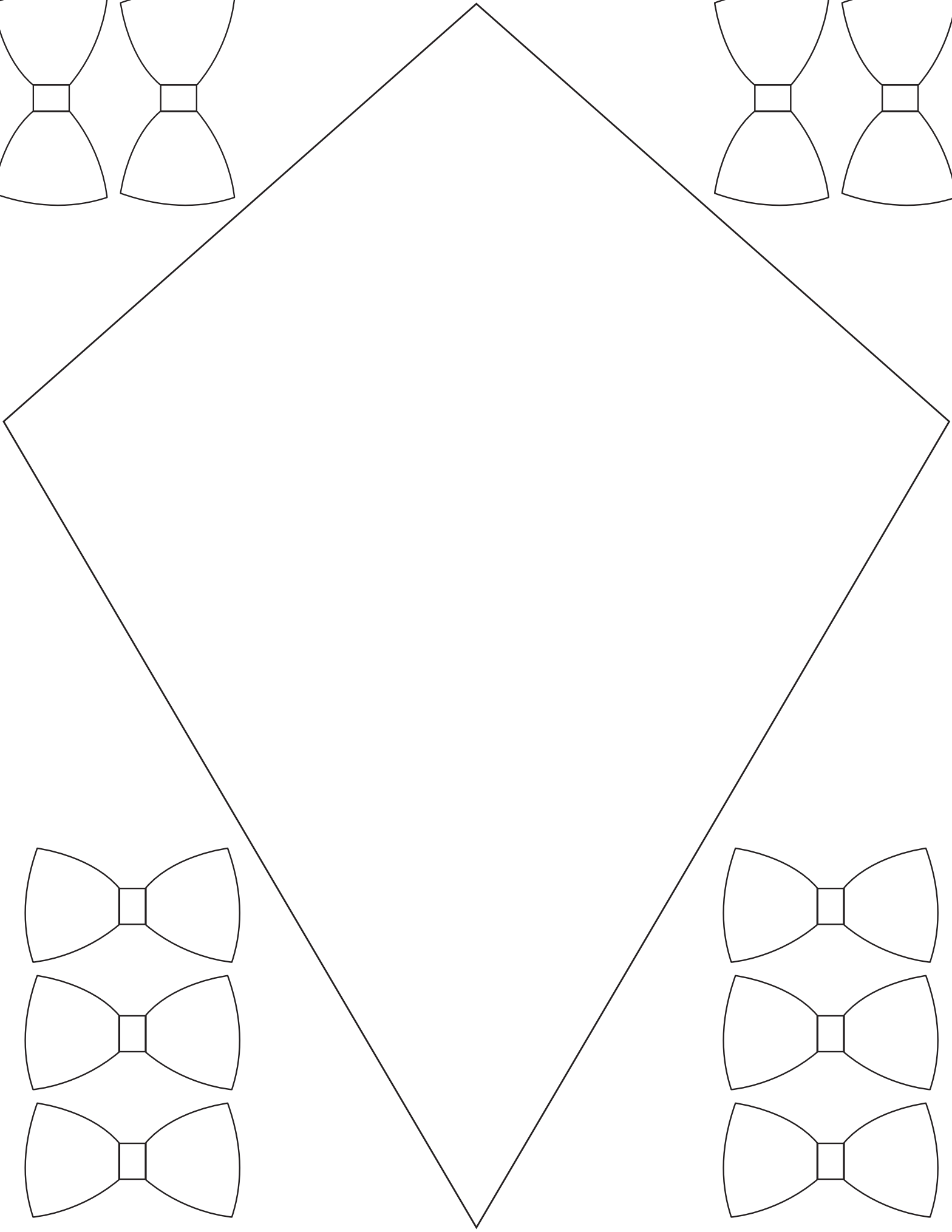
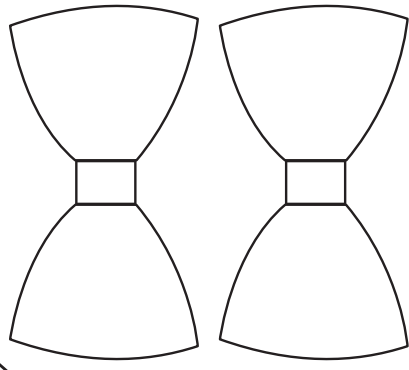
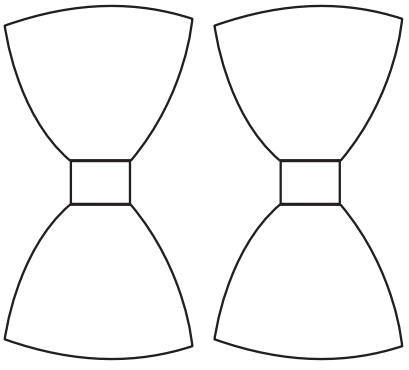
1. Kite Design and Embellishment Printable
2. Paper Straws (2 per kite)
3. String or twine for the kite (at least 25-30" long)
4. Glue Stick
5. All-purpose glue
6. Scissors
7. Pencil
8. Ruler
9. Markers/Crayons
10. Anything else you want to use to decorate your kite.



## INSTRUCTIONS

1. Cut out the kite pattern and bows.
2. Cut a length of twine or string, and tie one end to a paper straw about 2/3 of the way down. Cut the second straw into thirds to get three pieces. (They don't have to be exactly even. Just eyeball it.) Tie the other end of the twine to the middle of one of the paper straw pieces. This will be the kite handle.
3. Add a drop of glue onto the knot you tied on the handle so that the string won't slide off of the handle.
4. Place the side of the kite that you want to be the bottom (the side that will hold the paper straw frame) face up on the table. Using a ruler and a pencil, connect the corners to draw a cross. Squeeze a bead of craft glue along the cross.
5. Place the straws into the glue to form your kite frame, and allow the glue to dry for a few minutes. (Try to get the knot of the twine about even with the center of the cross before you press down the straw.)
6. Cut a long piece of ribbon or string to make the kite tail. Thread it through the long straw, and add a bead of glue at the top of the straw to keep the string from falling out.
7. Glue your decorative ribbons to the tail, and allow all glue to dry completely.
8. Design and decorate your kite. Be as creative as possible!
